With only about 5 kms into the event the tempo at the front was such, that several riders dropped off the back, and the majority soon split into 2 groups, in the lead were Ray Lampart, Russell McCue, Chris Orr and Dan Hill, by the time the reached Whispering Pines they had a 40 second lead over the peleton. Soon after the turn at the McLure Ferry, Ian Fillinger began to increase the tempo, and it did not take too long before the peleton caught the breakawy riders. No-one knew at this time, that Ian Fillinger had a plan, and it became evident at the Petersen Creek Hill what his intentions were.
